Over the past few months, our team has been diligently working to finalize this year's budget. Unfortunately, we faced a significant challenge as the state has reduced our funding allocation for some programs and eliminated a proposed increase for other services. As a result of these cuts, we will not be able to increase the caregiver pay this year for the CDS Program.

In addition, due to the reduced budget, we will need to make adjustments to some of our services and events such as transportation, ramps, and peer support. While we are committed to maintaining the quality and integrity of our core programs, certain activities and offerings will be impacted. Our priority remains to provide the essential services that you rely on, but there will be modifications as we adapt to these financial constraints.

We understand that these changes may raise concerns and questions. Please know that we are dedicated to minimizing the impact on our consumers as much as possible. Our team is exploring every available option to continue delivering the support and assistance you need within the constraints of our revised budget.

Despite these challenges, our commitment to fostering independence and enhancing the quality of life for all our consumers remains unwavering. We are confident that, with your understanding and support, we will continue to thrive and adapt to these changes effectively.
